

Policy on Meal Plan Exceptions

College Policy:

All students living in traditional residence halls <u>are automatically</u> enrolled in the <u>Ultimate Meal Plan</u>. Enrollment in the Ultimate Meal Plan is mandatory. Occasionally there are students with medical conditions who must eat a specific diet, which Dining Services is not capable of providing. This is very rare, as Sodexo Inc, a company specializing in College and University Dining operations is very flexible and creative in meeting students' specific nutritional needs.

Students may request a medical <u>exception</u> to this established policy by having their doctor or other qualified medical professional complete the <u>Physician Support Document</u> form. Fully completed forms will be reviewed by the Food Service Committee, who will make a determination on the facts. The Committee may need additional evidence from the doctor or qualified medical professional that no other solution or accommodation by the College or Sodexo is possible.

Students applying for a medical Exception should pick up the Physician Support Document form at the Business Services office, located on the ground floor of Alumni Hall.

Students participating in a College sponsored internship, with a work schedule that is in conflict with Taylor Dining Hall's normal hours of operation, may request an exception to the mandatory meal plan. In these cases, the student's meal plan will be determined based upon the amount of missed meal period for each semester.
