One-On-One Advising with a Faculty Member – Assumption Faculty

The group advising session in the morning provided an overview of major and Core Curriculum requirements, but the individual, one-on-one meeting with a faculty advisor is your opportunity to tailor that plan to your specific interests. Your orientation advisor will read your Academic Interests and Goals Survey and confirm that your COMPASS Learning Community enrollment is an appropriate choice for those goals and interests. He or she will review appropriate major and core courses, and help you develop a prioritized list for registration. He or she can also answer any questions you may have about your fall course selection.

In your advising meeting, your orientation advisor will approve appropriate courses in Webadvisor, the online platform for registering for classes, keeping track of graduation requirements, and accessing your class schedule. In this session, you'll learn your way around the Web Advisor platform, as well as Houndmail and the student portal. You will also be introduced to Brightspace, the online learning platform professors use to post course materials, etc.—you'll get practice in using this platform over the summer with activities that follow the orientation. You'll also sign up for a peer mentor through the Mentor Collective, a great way to connect with an upperclassman or recent alum who can answer your questions and talk about what's important to you.
