
Nurturing Students' Faith Development



 - Monitor maintenance issues and damage in the areas




Community Building

Residential Life is committed to creating a vibrant and active community in each residence hall on campus. Resident Assistants (RAs) are in place to be mentors, helpers, friends, and resources for all needs that students may have during their time living at Assumption.



Programming

Programming is an essential part of the living on campus at Assumption. Resident Assistants (RAs) put on over 300 hall programs per year across the different residence halls. RAs also put on 6, large-scale campus wide programs per year, known as Saturday Night Live (SNLs).



R.H.A. and Hall Council

Residence Hall Association (R.H.A.) offers programs opportunities for residential students to enhance their living experience. Hall Council allows all residential student to get involved in their hall to provide community enrichment programs.



Peer Ministry

Peer Ministry is a joint program between Residential Life and Campus Ministry. Peer Ministry provides programming within the residence halls and around campus that center around faith development. It is a great leadership opportunity that first year students can participate in.
