SUBJECT: Accommodations for Students with Disabilities

Accommodations

Assumption College is committed to providing equity, access, and inclusion for all students with disabilities within all aspects of the campus community.

For students entering the college environment, an individual with a disability must:

- Have a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits a major life activity;
- Have a record of such an impairment or
- Be regarded as having such impairment

In order to provide accommodations, students must self-identify, complete the Student Accessibility Consent Form and provide relevant and comprehensive documentation of disability to the Office of Student Accessibility Services. This office evaluates the clinical documentation and meets with students to discuss appropriate and reasonable accommodations. School plans, such as an Individual Education Plans (IEP), a Summary of Performance (SOP) or a Section 504 Plan are useful but do not, in and of themselves, serve as sufficient documentation to establish the rationale for accommodations.

Due to the length of the eligibility and accommodation process, it is recommended that documentation be submitted well in advance of any accommodation request.

All documentation of a student's disability is maintained in a confidential file in the Office of Student Accessibility Services.
